






#### 3. Alumni Talk on "Corporate Communication and Public Speaking" (22/02/25)






## 8. Women Development Cell

#### 1. Free Health Camp for Female Faculties (12/08/24 & 13/08/24)








#### 17. Spoken English and Soft Skills Add-on course (19/12/24)
